We provide services that are produced by us, purchased from public and private producers and organisations and arranged with the service voucher system.

Our priorities are availability and accessibility, personnel, prevention, management, digitalisation and representation.

The main objectives of the wellbeing services county strategy are targeted at the population and clients, the organisation, management and finances.

**Our values** are customer-orientation, open equality, effectiveness in line with finances, the ability to reform and a positive outlook on development.

### Financial figures

- The calculated funding of the South Ostrobothnia Wellbeing Services County in 2024 is EUR 909 million.
- State funding EUR 4,767/resident in 2024.
- Deficit EUR 45 million in 2023.
- Predicted deficit EUR 53 million in 2024.
- In accordance with the current legislation, the accumulated deficit has to be covered by the end of 2026.
